

## Western New York Hare Scramble Series Race Rules

### GENERAL

- Unsportsmanlike conduct both on and off the track of rider and/or pit crew will result in rider disqualification. This includes, but not limited to, any verbal threats, physical altercations, tampering with course.
- All riders must start, finish, and ride the entire race on the same machine.
- Awards will be given out 1 for every 3 in all classes. Maximum of 10th place.
- Year-end awards will be based on an average number of entries during the series in all classes.
- All events will count towards points and year end awards. Must attend 3 out of the 4 events to qualify.
- All classes will be advertised and run during every Western New York Hare Scramble event. Point standings will be kept for all classes.
- Riders may be allowed to walk, or ride bicycles prior to the start of the event (Saturday only). No one other than Race Officials can ride a motorized bike on the Race Day course prior to the event.
- Absolutely no riding of any unauthorized motorized/electric vehicle on the racecourse and start areas by rider and/or pit crew. This will result in immediate rider disqualification.
- The promoting track referee will handle all final scoring protests, penalties, and disqualifications. The promoting track referee will make the final decisions on all event disputes and protests. After the event has concluded, there will be no further changes to results and all results will be considered final.

### CLASSES

- Every effort must be attempted to be in the correct class. If you intentionally/knowingly ride in a class below your proper level, your result and points will be a zero for that event.
- Rider classification is determined by your highest level of skill in any organized series, regardless of discipline. We do not differentiate between Off-road and Motocross disciplines when it comes to skill.

EXAMPLE: AMA recognizes said rider as Off-road "C" but Motocross "B". Said rider must ride "B" class.

- Rider classification defined:

Beginner	D
Novice	C
Amateur	B
Expert	A/AA

## Race Classes Structure and Times

### **Race #1 – Mini Bike – 8am start – 1 hour race – \$30 (sign up from 7am-7:30am)**

4	60-65cc	60-65cc 2-stroke

### **Race #2 – Beg/Novice Bike – 9:30am start – 1 hour 45 min race – \$35 (sign up from 7am-8:45am)**

### **Race #3 – Amateur/Expert Bike – 12:00pm start – 2 hour race – \$35 (sign up from 7am-11:15am)**

1	Expert A/AA (100% payback)	Open
2	Amateur B	Open
3	Collegeboy 16-24	Open
4	Vet 30+ B	Open
5	Senior 40+ B	Open
6	Plus 50+	Open
7	Team	Open
8	Clydesdale (must weigh 240+ lbs)	Open CC but must weigh 240+ lbs

### **Race #4 – Quad All – 2:30pm start – 1 hour 30 min race – \$35 (sign up from 7am-1:45pm)**

Row #	Class	Bike Size
1	Quad Expert (100% payback)	200cc and above
2	Quad Amateur	200cc and above
3	Quad Novice	200cc and above
4	Quad Beginner	200cc and above
5	Quad Utility	200cc and above

## **SCORING**

- All riders must have a transponder on the visor of their helmet.
- All riders must have assigned stickers on the front number plate and helmet to be scored properly. ALL OTHER NUMBER STICKERS MUST BE REMOVED!
- It is the rider's responsibility to be scored. Riders who attempt to proceed through the scoring lane at high rates of speed, endangering the scoring personnel and equipment, may not be scored and could be penalized. Leaving the scoring tent prior to being scored may result in no score for the rider.
- You must pass under the Transponder reader to be counted.
- Passing in a "No Passing" zone, such as scoring, will result in a penalty. The minimum penalty is the loss of a position in the rider's class per rider passed, regardless of the class of the person passed.
- The race is "Officially" over when the sweep rider has cleared scoring and notified the scoring personnel or if 40 minutes have passed since the checkered flag.
- Each rider is entitled to examine his/her score. There is a 30 minute petition window, once results are posted. After that time, trophies will be awarded.
- There will be no scoring changes made to race results after the race day has been completed.

## **COURSE**

- All starts are dead engine start.
- Classes will start in rows according to Class structure/Row Chart.
- Red cross and yellow flags mean rider must slow down and no passing or jumping (wheels on the ground) until you are past the incident. Penalties will be determined by the referee.
- The checkered flag will be brought out as close to the advertised time as possible, determined by the promoter.
- Promoters reserve the right to bring the white/and or checkered flag out early due to weather/delays/conditions for the safety of the riders.
- The course will be marked with arrows and ribbon.
- Going outside of ribboned areas will be considered course cutting and result in a 1 lap penalty
- If arrows are marked on both sides of a trail, riders MUST stay between the arrows. Failure to do so will be considered course cutting and result in a 1 lap penalty.
- If you miss a marker or pass on the wrong side, you must go back and do it properly. Failure to do either of these will result in a 1 lap penalty.
